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THE WEST ISLAND PALLIATIVE CARE RESIDENCE'S GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY MARKS BEGINNING OF A NEW ERA IN PALLIATIVE CARE

KIRKLAND, June 15, 2018 – Today was a defining moment in the West Island Palliative Care Residence's (the Residence) future as dignitaries, board members, employees, volunteers, donors and special guests gathered to celebrate the start of construction to consolidate its two separate locations into a single, expanded facility housing all of its 23 beds. The 30,000 square foot extension of its original building on André-Brunet Street onto an adjacent tract of land represents a transformation of the Residence that will also be the home of its new branch, the recently launched Montreal Institute for Palliative Care (MIPC).

A team of medical, nursing, and supportive care staff together with volunteers collaborated in the planning of the new consolidated building which will see annual operational cost savings of approximately \$400,000 for the Residence. Designed with the goal of maintaining a home-like environment, the new building will offer a more efficient, medically relevant floorplan. Importantly, the new building will bring all staff and volunteers together so that patients and families will benefit from the consistent and seamless approach to care and services. A centrepiece of the new building will be an Education and Training Centre for the MIPC's programs and activities.

The Residence publically launched its *Caring & Sharing – Under One Roof* capital campaign in April to raise the \$12.5 million necessary to consolidate its two facilities in order to optimize its provision of care and to share best practices with the creation of the MIPC. With the generosity of its donors and the hard work of its staff and volunteers, the Campaign has raised just over \$7.5 million to date!

HIGHLIGHTS:

- Currently, the Residence provides its vital services in two separate locations in Kirkland and Pointe-Claire: the original facility on André-Brunet St. (9 beds) and a dedicated floor rented in a nearby long-term care facility on Stillview Avenue (14 beds).
- The original facility will be expanded by almost 30,000 square feet onto an adjacent tract of land and will allow for annual operational cost savings of approximately \$400,000.
- The new consolidated building will house the Montreal Institute for Palliative Care, a new branch of the West Island Palliative Care Residence.
- The Residence is seeking to raise \$12.5 million in order to consolidate its two separate locations into a single facility and to establish the MIPC. To date just over \$7.5 million dollars has been raised.
